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G.R.O.W. METHOD

Greet (This is all about a personal connection with the person you are meeting with.)

- · Get to know the person you are meeting with
- Learn their family names
- · Learn their job
- · Text them during the week and say "Praying for you today. I am here for you"

Review (This is all about reviewing what was learned the previous week.)

- At the beginning of each week, take 5 minutes and discuss the next step from the week before.
- · Each week in your notes, there will be instruction for what to review.

Outcomes/Obstacles (This is all about relating the topic to real life.)

- Each week there will be 2 questions to discuss.
- · What is the outcome of me doing this in my life?
- · What are the obstacles I might face?


W What/When (This is all about the next step.)

- Each week there will be a practical step for the disciple to take. It should take around 5-10 minutes.
- The goal is that they establish what they will do to apply the lesson and when they will do it.
- To conclude each session, it is important to schedule the time and place of the next meeting.

TIPS FOR DISCIPLE MAKERS

- Use the G.R.O.W. Method.
- Pray for your disciple.
- Connect with the person you are meeting with at least once a week.
- Go at their pace.
- · You don't have to have an answer for everything.

SESSION 1: HOW DO I KNOW I AM SAVED?

G - Greet

Starter Questions:

What was the best thing about your week? Tell me about your family. When did you give your life to Jesus?

R - Review

What are we doing here? We are here to become more like Jesus. Explain that you are meeting because no one walks alone at the Oaks and you want to be with them to point them to Jesus as they begin their journey with Him.

Pray: Ask that God would speak to you through His word as you learn about Him.

Set Up Video:

Our church is a place where we can ask questions and find truth together. Today we're going to answer the question, "How do I know that I'm saved?"

Watch the video / Teach the lesson FollowJesus.Oaks.Church

After you watch the video walk through these points together. At each scripture, encourage the person you're meeting with to make notes on the verse. Ask the question - "Read this and tell me what it means to you."

1 John 5:13 (NIV) "I write these things to you who believe in the name of the Son of God so that you may know that you have eternal life."

I know that I am saved because...

1. I have decided to follow Jesus.

Romans 10:9-10 (NIV) "If you declare with your mouth, "Jesus is Lord," and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. For it is with your heart that you believe and are justified, and it is with your mouth that you profess your faith and are saved."
1 John 5:11-12 (NIV) "And this is the testimony: God has given us eternal life, and this life is in His Son. Whoever has the Son has life; whoever does not have the Son of God does not have life."

2. The Holy Spirit enters my heart and makes me His heir.
Romans 8:16-17 (NIV) The Spirit himself testifies with our spirit that we are God's children. Now if we are children, then we are heirsheirs of God and co-heirs with Christ, if indeed we share in his sufferings in order that we may also share in his glory.
3. God's unconditional promise.
John 3:16 (NIV) For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life.
Why should I not sin?
Sin isn't the best way to live your life
Hebrews 12:5-8 (NIV) And have you completely forgotten this word of encouragement that addresses you as a father addresses his son? It says, "My son, do not make light of the Lord's discipline, and do not lose heart when he rebukes you, because the Lord disciples the one he loves, and he chastens everyone he accepts as his son." Endure hardship as discipline; God is treating you as children. For what children are not disciplined by their father? If you are not disciplinedand everyone undergoes disciplinethen you are not legitimate, not true sons and daughters at all.
Sin prevents us from living in the plans that God has for us.
Romans 12:2 (NIV) "Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is—his good, pleasing and perfect will."
4. Salvation is a free gift from God.
EPHESIANS 2:8-9 (NIV) "For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of Godnot by works, so that no one can boast."

- Our greatest passion as a church is to see people grow. Every week, take a step towards truth together. Encourage the person you are meeting with to memorize this scripture. Any time they feel discouraged that they are not really saved, they can remember and quote this scripture.
- Memorize this scripture this week: Romans 10:13 "Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved."

MY NEXT STEP

- As you bring your session to a close, tell the person you are meeting with that each week, there will be
 one small step to take to help them grow in Following Jesus. This week, it is this chart- Ask them to find
 5 minutes this week to think about their life before they began following Jesus. What are things that they
 didn't like or they shouldn't have done? Instruct them to write it down under "old life." Under the "New
 Life," instruct them to write down new habits / ways that they want to establish.
- Do 1 or 2 together today and encourage them to finish at home.*

2 Timothy 3:16-17 (NIV) "All scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the servant of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work."



(Observations) - After you write down the verse, ask yourself the following questions: What is God saying to me in this scripture? What things stuck out to me? Are there any repeated words? Write down your answers to these questions.

A (Application) - Personalize what you have read by asking yourself, "How does this apply to me right now?" and "What is my action step?" It could be instruction, encouragement, a new promise, or corrections for a particular area of your life. Write down how this scripture applies to your life today.

(Prayer) - Write out a prayer based off what you learned from this scripture. This can be as simple as asking God to help you use this scripture in your life or to understand this scripture more. Remember, prayer is a two-way conversation, so be sure to listen to what God has to say back to you.





SESSION 4: HOW DO I PRAY?

G - Greet

Remember: This part is all about relationship.

R - Review

Last week we learned how to read God's word. How is that going for you? Let's look at our S.O.A.P.'s from the week together.

Pray:

Watch the video / Do the Jesson FollowJesus.Oaks.Church

Matthew 6:5-13 (NIV) "And when you pray, do not be like the hypocrites, for they love to pray standing in the synagogues and on the street corners to be seen by others. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward in full. But when you pray, go into your room, close the door and pray to your Father, who is unseen. Then your Father, who sees what is done in secret, will reward you. And when you pray, do not keep on babbling like pagans, for they think they will be heard because of their many words. Do not be like them, for your Father knows what you need before you ask him. This then, is how you should pray:

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. And forgive us our debts as we also have forgiven our debtors. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from the evil one."

1. Start with Worship (Praise)

"Our Father in heaven" - Father, I praise you today, You are a good God. You protect me. You keep me from the evil one. You are my strength. You created everything and deserve all praise. Your ways are perfect- far better than mine, and your thoughts are better than mine. You are such a loving Father- Thank you for loving me. Today, I start my day by praising you.

2. Tell Him Who He Is (Declarations)

"Your name be holy" (hallowed be your name) - God, you are holy. Your name is far above any other name. Today, I give all that I am to you. You are the king of my life. I give you complete control of my heart. Get rid of anything that is taking my focus off you.

"Your kingdom come"- You are my King. Let me walk in your presence today. You are with me and you have given me authority to encourage others in trouble, help the hurting, and bring your freedom. Let me see people the way that you see them. Help me to love people like you do.

"Your will be done" - Have your way in my life. I don't have what it takes to lead my own life. So, I step down off the throne of my heart and ask that you would lead me. You are my promotion, provision, and protection. Tell me what to say, and I'll say it. Tell me what to do, and I'll do it. Lead me today.

3. Ask Him for What You Need (Requests)

"Give me daily bread" - I ask that you would provide for my needs. The Bible tells me that you will take care of everything that I need. You know all that I need today and I trust you to supply those things to me.

"Forgive my sins as I forgive others" - I ask that you would forgive me of my sins. Look inside my heart. If there is anything that isn't pleasing to you, show it to me. I ask that you would forgive me of my sins. I want my heart to be clean in your sight today. Help me to forgive others like you have forgiven me.

"Keep me from evil" - I ask that you would help me to stay away from temptation. Teach me to seek you when temptation arises. You have provided a way out for me. Take every bad thought that I have and change it to thoughts of you. Protect my heart, my mind, and my family from the enemy and his plans to kill, steal, and destroy.

4. End with Worship (Praise)

You are God. You are seated on your throne. I choose to serve you today. Every breath that I breathe is from you. I will live my life to please you today. This day belongs to you. I love you, Lord.







1 Corinthians 3:10-15 (ESV) By the grace God has given me, I laid a foundation as a wise builder, and someone else is building on it. But each one should build with care. If anyone builds on this foundation using gold, silver, costly stones, wood, hay or straw, their work will be shown for what it is, because the Day will bring it to light. It will be revealed with fire, and the fire will test the quality of each person's work. If what has been built survives, the builder will receive a reward. If it is burned up, the builder will suffer loss but yet will be saved—even though only as one escaping through the flames.



HOW DO I LEAD SOMEONE TO CHRIST?

1. Tell them the story of Jesus

- All have sinned and have fallen short of what it takes to come to God in our own goodness.
 Romans 3:23
- The price for our sin is physical and spiritual death separation from God in hell. Romans 6:23
- Since we sinned, God sent His only son to die for us to pay the price for our sins. John 3:16
- Jesus is the ONLY way to heaven. He is the way, the truth, and the life. He was a substitute sacrifice for us.
 John 14:6
- We are saved by God's grace and our faith in Him. Ephesians 2:8-10

2. Pray with them

- Romans 10:9-10 (NIV) If you declare with your mouth, "Jesus is Lord," and believe in your heart that God
 raised him from the dead, you will be saved. For it is with your heart that you believe and are justified,
 and it is with your mouth that you profess your faith and are saved.
- Have them repeat after you: Dear Jesus, I give my life to you, forgive me of my sins, take it all away. I can't live for myself anymore. I believe that you are the son of God who died on the cross for me, and now I put my life in your hands. In Jesus name, Amen.

3. Do the "Follow Jesus" study with them

- Ask them to go through "Follow Jesus" with you!

SIX STYLES OF EVANGELISM

THERE ARE MANY WAYS TO SHARE THE GOOD NEWS OF THE GOSPEL. FIND THE ONE THAT SUITS YOU BEST.

Becoming a Contagious Christian highlights six different evangelism styles to help you witness with confidence and power.

CONFRONTATIONAL:

Unfortunately, many stereotypes have developed from the abuses of this style. We don't like to be grabbed by the collar and asked, "Are you saved?" Yet, this style is strongly evident throughout Scripture. Peter uses it in Acts 2, when he addresses the crowd after Pentecost. "What must we do to be saved?" many asked, after Peter confronts and challenges them. "Repent and be baptized," demands Peter.

INTELLECTUAL:

This style is logical, rational and loves to deal with questions and ideas. "What do you think?" is often the opening question. In Acts 17, Paul uses this style with the Athenians, at the center of the intellectual civilization, as he debates with these learned men of Greece.

TESTIMONIAL:

This style is perhaps the most familiar to us. In John 9 the blind man who was healed by Jesus refuses to argue with the authorities as to whether Jesus is a good man or bad. "All I know is this," he says. "I was blind, and now I can see." We too, have personal experiences of Jesus to share like this blind man.

INTERPERSONAL / RELATIONAL:

This style is probably the easiest for us to use. Levi, in Luke 5, was a hated pariah, a tax-collector, yet he followed Jesus. His evangelism style was to throw a great bean-feast and invite his tax-collector buddies to come and meet Jesus. He used his relationships to bring others to Christ.

INVITATIONAL:

Many feel comfortable with this style. In John 4, the Samaritan woman runs back to town and invites her friends to "come and see" Jesus. Who does not like to be invited to meet someone?

SERVING:

Dorcas is described in Acts 9 as filling her days with acts of kindness and charity. Often this style melts the hearts of unbelievers because it demonstrates love over a long period of time.
